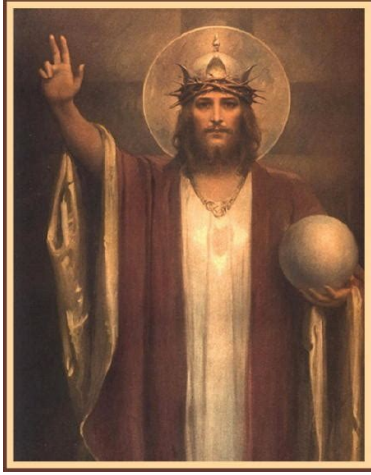

The Feast of Christ The King – November 24th



Christ the King Sunday, officially called ‘the Feast of Christ the King’ and also referred to as ‘the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe’ is a feast day that celebrates the full authority of Christ as King and Lord of the universe.

One of the reasons this date is so fitting is because the liturgical year begins with Advent, which is the season of awaiting the coming of Christ. Observing Christ the King Sunday at the end of the liturgical year celebrates and emphasizes the Kingship of Christ.

As a Christian, we are called to recognize Jesus Christ as King of Kings, the Messiah, Emmanuel, Lord and Savior, and the Bread of Life, among other names. John 8:12 tells us that Jesus is the light of the world.

Whoever follows Him will not walk in darkness, but have the light of life.

While we celebrate Jesus and the ways He has been a light in our lives

life, let us pray for those who are lost in a world of darkness that they may come to be children of the light.

Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary



The Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, **November 21st**, commemorates the presentation of the Blessed Virgin as a child by her parents in the Temple in Jerusalem. Before Mary’s birth, her parents received a heavenly message that they would bear a child. In thanksgiving to God for the gift of Mary’s birth, they brought her to the Temple to consecrate their only daughter to the Lord. This commemorates the faith of her parents, Joachim and Anne, and the purity of Mary.

November – The Month of the Holy Souls

The souls in purgatory died in the mercy of God, this is why they are called holy; however, because they still had attachment to sin at the time of their death, they must undergo a spiritual purification of their souls before they are able to fully love God with their whole heart, mind, and soul for all eternity. Those in purgatory cannot pray for themselves, this is why they are also called "poor" souls. They can no longer merit anything for themselves (their opportunity for increasing

in merit was during their earthly lives) and they must rely entirely on others to pray and make sacrifices on their behalf. As they are nevertheless part of the Communion of Saints, they depend upon us to help ease their suffering and quickly advance them through their purification so that they can join the saints in heaven. Prayers for the faithful departed are pleasing to God. It is an act of charity that we can give for those we have known and loved. Pray especially for those who have no one to pray for them.
