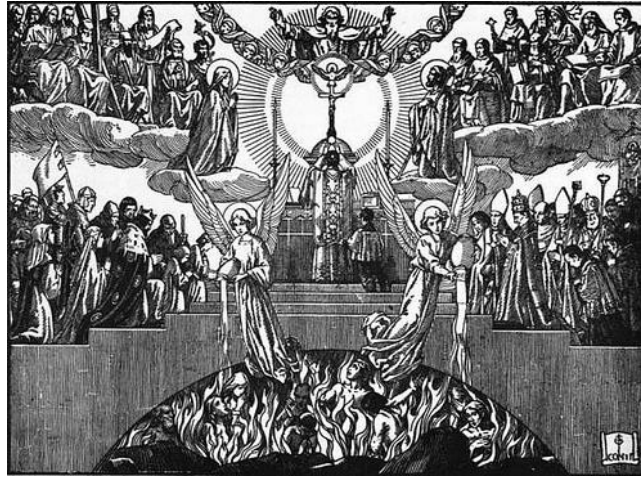

MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS



Each November the Church celebrates the Month of the Holy Souls. Beginning with All Saints day on November 1st and immediately followed by All Souls day on November 2nd, the Church calls us to remember the unity of the Church Triumphant in heaven, the Church Militant here on earth, and the Church Suffering in Purgatory. Throughout her history the Church has understood the importance of praying for the Holy Souls in purgatory, who by the nature of their condition, can no longer pray for themselves. Many great saints including St. Gertrude the Great, St. Padre Pio, and St. Catherine of Genoa, have taught extensively on purgatory. Enlightened by mystical experiences, they have profoundly deepened our understanding, and reiterated the Church's call to pray for the dead. While the Holy Souls are unable to pray for themselves, they are powerful intercessors for those who pray for them in this life. Many devotions and prayers are available to fulfill this Spiritual Work of Mercy. Copies of prayers for the Holy Souls are available in the Church and on the Parish Website.

Advent Wreath Ceremony: The use of Advent wreaths dates back to the middle ages. The circle of evergreens symbolizes eternal life, and the lighting of the candles symbolizes the light of Christ coming into the world. The candles are in the liturgical colours of the season. Purple being the penitential colour, representing the penance, good works, and prayers we offer. The rose for Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday, marking the halfway point of advent, and our hope in Christ. Each week we will be sharing the wreath prayers for the following week.

The head of the household leads the prayers, and various family members light the candles.

Blessing the wreath on the eve of the First Sunday:

(sprinkle the wreath with holy water and pray)

O God, by whose word all things are sanctified, pour forth thy blessing upon this wreath, and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive from Thee abundant graces. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The following prayer is said, and the first purple candle is lit before the evening meal each day during the first week:

O Lord, stir up Thy might, we beg Thee, and come that by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by Thy deliverance. Through Christ our Lord. Amen

Catholic Family Life: To day is the Solemnity of Christ the King! This incredible feast when we celebrate the Kingship of Christ. As a family today pray the Litany of Christ the King. Have the children make and decorate a cardboard crown and place it on your family altar, as a reminder that Christ is the King of our hearts and families.
