**Bill C-7:** This past week the CCCB along with other faith leaders released an open letter in opposition to bill C-7. The religious leaders said in part: "We are obliged to express our strong concern and opposition to Bill C:7 which, among other things, expands access to euthanasia and assisted suicide to those who are not dying. It perplexes our collective minds that we have come so far as a society yet, at the same time, have so seriously regressed in the manner that we treat the weak, the ill, and the marginalized." "In the first great [revelation](#), He (Christ) made known to her His ardent desire to be [loved](#) by [men](#) and His design of manifesting His [Heart](#) with all Its treasures of [love](#) and mercy, of sanctification and [salvation](#). He appointed the Friday after the [octave](#) of the [feast](#) of [Corpus Christi](#) as the [feast](#) of the [Sacred Heart](#); He called her "the Beloved Disciple of the [Sacred Heart](#)", and the heiress of all Its treasures. The [love](#) of the [Sacred Heart](#) was the fire which consumed her, and [devotion to the Sacred Heart](#) is the refrain of all her writings."

One of the greatest devotions entrusted to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, was that of First Fridays. This beautiful act of reparation to the Sacred Heart, consists of attending Mass and receiving Communion on nine consecutive First Fridays. With the intention of honouring Christ's Sacred Heart. To those who faithfully practice this devotion Christ promises;

*"the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."*

This promise is the last of 12 promises connected to the Devotion to the Sacred Heart. For more information see;
